
Chances are, if you're a serious poultry enthusiast in Australia, you've read or heard Claire's work! Claire writes, talks and lives horticulture and sustainability.

Can your rural property withstand a bushfire?

Maleny Rural Fire Brigade are now urging landholders to prepare their properties now for what is expected to be a dry bushfire season.

Operation Cool Burn has now been officially launched and urges rural and regional property owners to be proactive in preparing their land against the risk of bushfires.

The long-range weather forecast showed little rain was expected across the SEQ regions. Because the long-range weather forecast doesn't have any great rainfall events expected so now is the time to get on the front foot and prepare rural properties for the next season. Queensland's bushfire season traditionally begins mid-year



The recently past intense summer

period saw large forested areas razed due to a build-up of fire fuels and it is important that proper preparation is carried out over the next few months to prevent a repeat next season.

Landowners should consider reducing fire fuel loads where possible, put in fire breaks, mow lawns particularly around structures, slash overgrown vegetation and empty gutters.

Sunshine Coast loves Solar Energy

The Sunshine Coast has one of the largest rooftop solar uptakes of any local government area in Australia, with 41% of dwellings choosing to harness the sun and last week Caloundra was named one of the top five rooftop solar postcodes in Australia.

Sunshine Coast Council is helping residents make the most of their investment and has engaged an independent renewable energy expert to assist

Energy guru Trevor Berrill said installing solar panels was just the first step to saving on your energy bill.

"A common reason people don't get the dollar return they should is they install panels then forget about them," Mr Berrill said.

"To get the very best return on your investment and maybe even a credit rather than a bill, you need to understand your tariff and then use your energy accordingly.

"For instance, someone on the high bonus rate feed in tariff of around 50c per kilowatt-hour (kWh) should be using their appliances at night, while those on the newer 8c per kWh tariff rate should use their appliances during the day."

"There are also impressive additional feed in tariffs available to solar owners and independent comparison websites like WATTever can help you find them."

"Our community have the real power to change our region's energy use, so it's important we help them on their renewable journey." Cr Robinson said.

The Range Croquet Club - Maleny

Croquet is often considered a sport for older people.
Contradicting this opinion is a group of younger players at the top levels. Robert Fletcher from Australia, was world champion in 2013 at just 20years of age.

One of the reasons for the appearance of elderliness in clubs might be that experienced players often refer to one another as "pegging out" or having "pegged out".

On Tuesday Nick Cram
"pegged out". To the nonplaying observer this gives an
impression that club members
are regularly dropping off the
perch, dying. In fact,
"pegging out" is the primary
objective in a croquet game. It
means the player has conclusively
won the game scoring 12 hoops
with each ball and then hitting
them against the centre peg.

Who Remembers this?

In a past lifetime, not too long ago the Maleny District was a noted dairy producing area. Originally butter was the main product produced, however in later years milk production became more important.

Th building pictured below was the third Butter Factory and was constructed in 1940 in what at the time was known as Factory Road, or as it is now known, Coral Street.



On the 1st July 1978 the Maleny Co-operative Dairy Association amalgamated with Caboolture Dairy Co-Op and the third Maleny Butter Factory in Coral Street, stopped producing butter in July 1981 but continued to process milk and used as depot for milk from the area prior to being transported to Caboolture.

In the 1950's Maleny supported some 300 dairy farms. Then came deregulation and by 1980 only 20 remained. This condemned the area as a prime producer of dairy products.

Today the dairying tradition is continued through the efforts of Maleny Dairies and the Maleny Cheese Factory. Both companies continue to produce ultra premium dairy products.
